Professor Pasi Sahlberg - Research Director Gonski Institute for Education

Pasi Sahlberg is professor of education policy, and research director at the Gonski Institute for Education, University of New South Wales Sydney in Australia. He is a Finnish educator, scholar and author who has worked as mathematics and science teacher, teacher-educator, researcher, and policy advisor in Finland.

Pasi's international career includes senior specialist at the World Bank in Washington, DC, lead education specialist at the European Commission, and visiting professor at Harvard University.

Pasi is an international thought-leader and speaker. He has written widely about education system change and published over 150 academic and professional articles and books.
