## Welcome to the programme for Bristol Teacherfest 2022!

In this our third year, we are delighted once more to offer a wide range of events to Bristol teachers. This year there is a change of focus, with many events being hosted by schools within the Bristol Education Partnership (BEP). Colleagues are generously offering their time and expertise to share and discuss work that is taking place within their own settings. Also included are weekly sessions taking place at Bristol University's School of Education, making the important link with research.

In addition, we have a range of excellent speakers from further afield, not least, the inspirational **Pasi Sahlberg**, who will be joining us from Finland to talk about how to build excellence and equity post-pandemic.

There is no overarching theme for Teacherfest 2022, however, BEP priorities are reflected across

Our fourth keynote speaker, **Professor Rob Coe**, will be contributing on behalf of the Education Endowment Foundation, speaking about What makes great teaching. Not to be missed!

Whilst Teacherfest 2020 and 2021 took place against the backdrop of the pandemic with all events online, we are hopeful that this year, some sessions can take place live. One of the

strengths of BEP is the opportunity for teachers from different schools to learn with and from each other and we believe that this can happen more effectively face to face. We hope therefore that you will take the opportunity to get out and about to meet colleagues from other settings and visit other schools.


