



#### 1. THE STATE OF PLAY

# 80%

of adults believe that children are under pressure to grow up too quickly.

# 85%

of parents say kids today spend less time PLAYing than they did when they were their children's age.

# children say that they are too busy to PLAY.

#### Long-term impacts of PLAY deprivation include:

- depression
- aggression
- reduced self-control
- poor resilience
- obesity

#### Children with mental health issues

"A primary cause of the rise in mental disorders is a decline over decades in opportunities for children and teens to PLAY, roam, and engage in other activities independent of direct oversight and control by adults."



"PLAY is integral to a child's education. The importance of playtime for children cannot be overemphasised to parents, schools, and community organisations."









Start a movement to bring back PLAY




- An annual award for schools, educators or students in Australia
