






Achievement gaps since 2000



Conclusion: Equitable education systems focus on

- Eliminating structures, policies and practices causing inequities
- Needs-based funding of schools
- Clear definition of and precision in monitoring equity
- Whole school, whole child approach to learning & wellbeing
- Building collaborative, trust-based cultures across the system
- Intervening early!
